



Think Football Festivals Y5/6: (Think)

Primary Aim: The main goal of this event is to give Year 5 and 6 children the chance to compete and collaborate, developing and designing tactics for various football activities. This will be facilitated by organising groups of three teams to compete in different game variations and training sessions.

Core Values:

Decision Making - Tactical Awareness - Problem Solving Teamwork - Following Rules

Primary Objectives:

- For pupils to play modified football games, applying basic attacking and defending tactics.
- For pupils to enjoy communicating, collaborating, and competing with each other.
- To compare their performance with previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve personal bests.

The event will feature a circuit of football activities, including two training activities interspersed with two different modified football matches, all led by sports leaders.

Important Note: This event is not a competition. It is designed for participants who may not have extensive experience in grassroots football but have an interest in the game.

Connect Football Festival Y3/4: (Connect)

Primary Aim: The main goal of this event is to give Year 3 and 4 children a chance to compete and collaborate with peers from their own and other schools. It emphasises positive leadership, teamwork, and the ability to listen to others' ideas. This will be achieved through a series of football activities.

Core Values:

Leadership - Sharing - Listening - Teamwork

Primary Objectives:

- For pupils to play modified football games.
- For pupils to enjoy communicating, collaborating, and competing with each other.
- To evaluate and recognise their own success.

The event will feature a circuit of six activities led by sports leaders, each focusing on different football skills while promoting the main aims of teamwork and collaboration.

Important Note: This event is not a competition. It is designed for participants who may not have extensive experience in grassroots football but have an interest in the game.

Year 3 & 4 Cup:

Mixed (School Sport) - The event will see the teams competing in a round robin format before progressing to a knockout stage. The cup will begin with 3 regional heats at Staveley miners' welfare, Gosforth playing fields and Brookfield community school with the top two qualifying for Year 3 & 4 finals day.

Every team entering the event should have a squad of a maximum of 10 with 6 players on the pitch.

Girls (School Sport) - The event will see the teams competing in a round robin format before progressing to a knockout stage.
